In my opinion the lighting is a touch uneven with there being some blownout highlights in the flames which is always a challenge to control up close. The strong vertical shape of the flames adds dimension and the background embers from the coals ad nice depth to the image.	11	
PREPARING SHIOYAKI	An interesting capture of cooking of the fish over hot embers in the Shioyaki style from Japan. While the focus on the fish and the embers identifies them as the point of interest, the photographer could consider using contrasting backgrounds when composing images as here the background and the subjects are of similar tones. The story of the cooking technique has been well defined in this image.	9	
RUBBISH BURNING	This image of burning the cleared vegetation draws the eye into the flames rising from the rubbish. I like the nice vertical lines from the base through the flames to the smaoke in the sky. I do feel the focus is a bit soft and wonder if this has been cropped from a larger image. The photographer has captured the light well, controlling the highlighs in the flames and the darks in the smoke.	12	
RUMP ROAST	A quirky title with a play on the set subject has captured the cows in front of a burning fire. I feel that the cows are a bit crowded in the image and would like to see more space at the rear end of the left-most cow. I do like how the photographer has chosen the portrait orientation of the frame as it gives the image depth and dimension.	13	
SMOKO	An intriguing image of the woman blowing a smoke ring is the subject of this image. The composition is balanced with the subject in the right half of the frame and the textured space to the left. There are bright white blownout spots on her lip and eyebrow that I find are a distraction and could be remove in post to balance the lighting. I do like the effect of the grungy, grainy textures presented in this image.	9	
SMOLDERING REMAINS	The glowing embers of a fire gives the image a sense of warmth complemented by the rish warm colours. I feel the image is a touch out of balance and perhaps consideration could be given to a tighter crop in from the left and down from the top to concentrate attention to the embers. I feel the contrast between the white ash and the dark burnt coals add to the story of a smoldering fire.	13

I likle how the graduated tones range from the foreground green through the grey sof the fog to the muted blues of the sky. In my opinion, I feel the image is top heavy with too much sky and the image would have more imapct if it was cropped down by about a third. The image could also be either be resized or cropped in from the side to reduce the size to meet the club requirements for maximum sizing. I do like the silhouette effect of the trees in the middle adding depth to the image.	9	
DUCKING OUT	A well captured image of a duck and duckling in the bright sun by the water. I like how the background is suitably blurred to isolate mother and chick as the focal point of interest. The composition is nicely balanced and I would suggest that the image either be resized or cropped in from the side to reduce the size to meet the club requirements for maximum sizing. The photographer has done well with the focus which is sharp and details with clarity the textures and colours of both birds.	13	
FALLEN FEATHER	A monochrome macro-style image of a white feather that gracefully sweeps across the diagonal of the frame. While I find the tips of the feather are sharply focused, the focus drops away as you'd expact from a shallow depth of field in this type of photography causing deatail near the central quill to be lost. Overall the lighting is nicely balanced adding to soft dreamy feel from the image.	14	
MATCHED	A blaze of vibrant colour from the matching hat and the dress. I do feel that the hat is crowded into the top left corner and I would suggest reframing the image to have more space around the hat. I do find the bright areas of background colour distracting and I wonder if the photographer would consider toning these down a touch in post to enhance the dominance of the subject in the image. I do like how the photographer has chosen to emphasise the patterns of colours through the image.	14
